Keynote Speakers

Professor Gregory Schultz PhD

Gregory Schultz, is a Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology and a Director of the Institute for Wound Research at the University of Florida. Dr. Schultz's research focuses on the role of growth factors, cytokines and proteases in normal and chronic wound healing in skin and eye.

Greg has published more than 210 research papers, chapters and review articles, which have been cited more than 5,100 times, and he has over a dozen patents in the area of wound healing. He has received over \$11 million in total grants from the National Institutes of Health, pharmaceutical companies, and US Army, and he is a consultant for multiple biotechnology companies. He is the Chair of the Wound Bed Preparation Advisory Board, and he served as President of the Wound Healing Society from 1999-2001.

Prof Mark Ferguson PhD

Mark Ferguson is the Co-founder and CEO of Renovo a Biotechnology Company spun out of the University of Manchester, which is developing novel pharmaceutical therapies to prevent scarring or accelerate healing following wounding. Renovo is currently the largest Biotech company in the UK. Since the age of 28, Mark has been Professor in the School of Biological Sciences at the University of Manchester, where he has held a number of administrative posts including Head of Department and Dean. Throughout this time his research interests have focused on cellular and molecular mechanisms in wound healing, particularly the prevention of scarring

and stimulation of chronic wound healing, developmental mechanisms in normal and cleft palate formation and is the discoverer of temperature dependant sex determination in alligators and crocodiles. He is the recipient of numerous international awards, prizes and honours for this research work, including the 2002 European Science Prize, and the author of over 400 research papers, books and patents. He has raised more than £50M of peer reviewed research grant income to support these fundamental investigations.

Mark holds Fellowships from the Royal Colleges of Surgeons in Ireland (FFD) and Edinburgh (FDS) and is a Founding Fellow of the UK Academy of Medical Sciences (FMed Sci). He is a Member or Fellow of a number of learned Societies, Secretary of the European Tissue Repair Society and was made a "Commander of the British Empire" (CBE) by the Queen in 1999 for services to Health and Life Sciences.

Professor Fiona Wood, FRCS, FRACS, AM

Fiona Wood is the Director of the Western Australian Burns Service and co-founder and Director of Clinical Cell Culture, the commercial side of a research project to create spray-on skin cells. In addition, Fiona is a consultant Plastic Surgeon to both Royal Perth and Princess Margaret Hospitals and Chair of the McComb Research Foundation.

Her research through the McComb Foundation and as Director of C3 is focused on scarless healing. She is involved in several collaborative research projects focusing on tissue-guided regeneration.

Fiona has been involved in a number of education and disaster response programs associated

with her interest in burns. In addition, she has been the recipient of the 2003 Australian Medical Association 'Contribution to Medicine' Award and an Order of Australia Medal for work with Bali bombing victims.

Fiona was named West Australian of the Year for 2004, and was nominated as a National Living Treasure and Australian Citizen of the Year in 2004. Fiona was again named West Australian of the Year for 2005, and received the honour of being named Australian of the Year in 2005. Recently, Fiona and Marie Stoner, co-founder of Clinical Cell Culture, won the coveted 2005 Clunies Ross Award for their contributions to Medical Science in Australia.

Associate Professor Keryln Carville RN, BHSoc (Nsg) STN (Cred) PhD

Keryln Carville has been recognised as a leader in wound management within Australia and the Asia/Pacific area for nearly 2 decades. She holds a Clinical Nurse Consultant position (Wound, Ostomy and Continence Services) at Silver Chain Nursing Association W.A and she is an Associate Professor Domiciliary Nursing at Silver Chain and Curtin University.

Keryln has developed innovative wound management services - establishing Leg Ulcers assessment clinics for Silver Chain across the Fremantle metropolitan area. She developed and published a nationally recognised Wound Care Manual through Silver Chain that is currently in its 5th edition.

She was nominated by her employer for the Western Australian Citizen of the Year award in the category of Community Service and The Professions (1998).

Professor Bart Currie PhD

Bart Currie is an Infectious Diseases Physician at Royal Darwin Hospital and Professor in Medicine at the Northern Territory Clinical School, Flinders University. He is also Head of the Tropical and Emerging Infectious Diseases Division of the Menzies School of Health Research at Charles Darwin University.

His areas of interest include clinical and epidemiological aspects of tropical and emerging infections, development of treatment guidelines and clinical toxicology.

**Dr Dianne Stephens MBBS
FANZCA FJFICM OAM**

Dianne Stephens is the Director of Intensive Care at the Royal

Darwin Hospital. She completed her anaesthetic and intensive care training in 1997 and moved to Darwin in 1998 as the first Intensive Care Specialist in the Northern Territory. Dianne established the NT organ donation agency in 2001.

Dianne received a Medal of The Order of Australia (OAM) for her role in the management of the critically ill Bali bombing victims in 2002 and was deployed with the Australian Defence Force for 3 months to Iraq in 2005. She was also involved with the Australian Defence Force response to the second Bali bombings in addition to caring for the victims at Royal Darwin Hospital. Her main interests are in the critical care management of disasters, trauma and sepsis.

**Mr David Read CSC MBBS
FRACS**

David Read has been a general surgeon in Darwin for 5 years with wide ranging interests in trauma, burns, surgical oncology, paediatrics and surgical outreach to indigenous communities.

David is a Major in the Australian army reserve and has seen active service in Timor, Bali and Iraq. David was integral in the Royal Darwin Hospital response to both the Bali bombings and the Timor flare ups. From these experiences he has gathered extensive experience in dealing with blast injuries and military gunshot wounds. David received the Conspicuous Service Cross for efforts on the Tarmac at Denpasar airport after Bali 1.
