Conditions Governing AWMRF Grants

Areas of Research

The Australian Wound Management Research Foundation (AWMRF) supports research into any area that is related to wounds, wound healing or wound management.

Grants available in 2010.

The AWMRF will award seeding grants which will enable researchers to gain preliminary information that can be used to prepare applications for large scale grants from different funding bodies. The Foundation will allocate funds up to a maximum budget of \$10,000 for any individual Research Project. The number and value of the awards that are made will depend on the quality of the applications that are received.

Tenure

The tenure of the research grants is for one year from July 1, 2010. Funds not used at the completion of that time are to be returned to the AWMRF.

Release of funds

Funds will be released to the appropriate administering Institution once a copy of the approval from the appropriate Ethics Committee has been received by the AWMRF.

Publication of successful applications

The AWMRF may publish and release details of the successful applications to the media, general public and research community in future publications

Reports

Successful applicants are required to provide an interim report on the research 6 months after commencing their study, and a final report on completion of the study.

Submission of Applications

Applications must be received by AWMRF by the advertised closing date which is March 5, 2010. Applications may be submitted by email or by paper copy. If submitting by email, they must be submitted as an attachment, which is to be a Word document or a PDF file, in a single file.
