KEYNOTE SPEAKERS:

PROFESSOR COURTNEY LYDER is an outstanding leader, a senior consultant to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. His research focuses on improving patient safety in hospitals, with a particular emphasis on seniors. Another one of his key interests involves identifying early indicators of tissue damage that could help identify pressure ulcers, before they become a problem. He is in great demand as a consultant, within the nursing home industry.
