KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Associate Professor **Paul Anantharajah Tambyah** completed medical training at the National University of Singapore and then national service as a medical officer in the Singapore Armed Forces before doing postgraduate training in the USA. His training in infectious diseases was at the University of Wisconsin under Dr Dennis Maki. Since his return to Singapore, he has been actively involved in clinical care, research, and teaching at the National University of Singapore. He is currently Head of the Division of Infectious Diseases in the Department of Medicine, National University of Singapore, and is an International Councilor for the Society for Healthcare Epidemiology in America and a Council Member of the Western Pacific Society of Chemotherapy and Infectious Diseases. His main research interests are in nosocomial infections and emerging infectious diseases.



Associate Professor **Stephan Harbarth** is currently Senior Research Associate, Hospital Epidemiologist and Attending Physician at the University Hospital, Geneva, Switzerland. He has made outstanding contributions in the field of infectious disease epidemiology, focusing on prevention and control of nosocomial infections and antimicrobial resistance in hospitals. In addition he pioneered studies on the cultural and regulatory factors that influence antimicrobial use in different countries. Dr Harbarth studies on the impact and control of nosocomial MRSA transmission have increased understanding of the epidemiology of MRSA and improved the ability to combat this microorganism. His research on the adverse effects of prolonged antibiotic prophylaxis after surgery and on the ecologic bias associated with group-level data analyses of antibiotic-use-versus-resistance relationships have been important contributions to the field of antibiotic resistance and also impacted on policy making.



Professor **Dennis Maki** is the Ovid O. Meyer Professor of Medicine in the Section of Infectious Diseases at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health in Madison, Wisconsin, Hospital Epidemiologist at the University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics, and Attending Physician in the University of Wisconsin Center for Trauma and Life Support. In his activities as an infectious disease consultant, critical care physician and hospital epidemiologist, Dr. Maki has devoted his research career to the prevention of nosocomial infections and management of septic shock and other life threatening infections. Dr Maki's conference attendance is kindly sponsored by 3M.

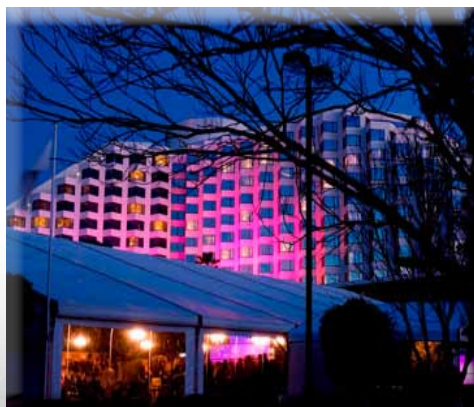
